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Procedure	<ul> <li>WESTS' staff's experience and professional judgement, including in respect of safety.</li> <li>WESTS will consider all applications submitted considering the factors above and the eligibility criteria.</li> <li>The parent/legal guardian is responsible for providing up-to-date information in respect of the custody arrangements to the School, including any information regarding changes impacting the student(s) transportation services.</li> <li>The parent/legal guardian recognizes and accepts that there is risk inherent in the implementation of student transportation to two addresses. The bus driver is not responsible for managing alternating schedules for students. Boarding assistance at the School will not be provided by school staff for students over 10 years old.</li> <li>All other transportation policies continue to apply, including all other policies related to other elements of student eligibility for student transportation services.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Since transportation is provided to a student based on a Eligible Primary Home Address, the Eligible Secondary Home Address, under the joint custody arrangement, will be the address used for consideration of joint custody.</li> <li>The school will submit the Joint Custody Application Form through BusPlanner Workflow.</li> <li>If the student(s) is under the age of 10, the school will give the Elementary (under age of 10) Joint Custody Transportation Form to the parent/legal guardian. Both parent/legal guardian will complete and sign the Elementary (under the age of 10) Joint Custody Transportation Form and submit it to the school. The school sends the completed and signed forms to WESTS for review and final decision.</li> </ul>



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Approval of a Joint Custody Application will remain in effect so long as the student remains at the school and so long as the joint custody arrangements remain the same as set out in the Application, subject to any generally applicable changes that may be made in respect of school boundaries and subject to any safety issues that may arise, including in respect of the implementation of any Transportation Plan.
A new Joint Custody Application form may be required if circumstances change, including if the student moves to a different elementary or secondary school, starts a secondary school, if there is a change in custodial arrangements, or if there are concerns raised about the implementation or effectiveness of the Transportation Plan.
