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Statement	Students who are eligible to travel to school on a school bus are expected to demonstrate and maintain appropriate and safe behaviour aboard the vehicle in accordance with the School Code of Conduct and RR-01 Responsibilities of Students. Students who do not behave in an appropriate and safe manner may be subject to discipline including temporary or permanent loss of school bus transportation privilege.
Reporting Requirements for Bus Drivers	Further to the Education Act, bus drivers, operators and WESTS are required to report serious student behaviour to the principal as outlined in Sections 306. (1) and/or 310. (1) of the <i>Education Act</i> (such activities are listed under Level 3 and Level 4).
	Bus drivers are required under the <i>Education Act</i> to report to the principal as soon as reasonably possible, when they become aware that a student has engaged in an activity described below under Level 3 and/or Level 4.
	Bus drivers will contact the principal by phone as soon as reasonably possible and will complete the Safe Schools Incident Report – Form 2 when the bus driver returns at the end of their shift. The report will be forwarded to the principal when completed. The bus driver will also complete the WESTS Incident Report, stating that a Safe Schools Incident Report has been filed.
	The bus operator will receive an Acknowledgement of Receipt of the Safe Schools Incident Report from the principal. The Form will indicate that the principal has either taken action or that no action is required.
	If the situation presents an immediate risk of harm to the driver or other students, such as the presence of a weapon or a physical assault, dispatch will be contacted and will call police immediately. Notification to the principal will follow. Safety of the students and driver will always be the priority.



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	If a student engages in activity described below in Level 1 or Level 2 the bus driver will complete a Driver Report of Student Misconduct form and submit it to the principal as soon as practicable. The principal will respond on the form and advise the driver and bus operator of any action taken regarding the misconduct.

	Consequences: As stated in the <i>Ontario Schools Code of Conduct,</i> the time spent travelling by school bus is an extension of the school day. The school principal is therefore obligated to investigate and may suspend a pupil from school for the above-mentioned infractions. All consequences under Level 3 will result in loss of school bus privileges for a period of time to be determined in consultation with WESTS and the school principal.

	 Consequences: a) As stated in the Ontario Schools Code of Conduct, the time spent travelling by school bus is an extension of the school day. The school principal must suspend a pupil from school and conduct an investigation to determine whether to recommend to the board that a pupil be expelled for the above noted infractions. b) Loss of school bus privileges for an undetermined amount of time or permanent loss of school bus privileges can be imposed in consultation with WESTS based on the above noted infractions.

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Level 3 and Level 4

Level 3 and Level 4 infractions must be reported on the Safe School Incident Report Form Part I. These forms will be available at the operator's office. An Acknowledgement of Receipt of the Incident Report Form will be sent by the principal to the bus operator.

The principal must follow the School Board Code of Conduct once any Level 3 and/or Level 4 infractions are reported to them.
